Community feedback on the draft directions is being collected until **July 10, 2017**. If you did not provide feedback at the open house, we would encourage you to review the open house display information online, or at the District Office, and complete a response form. Your feedback will help to refine draft recommendations to go forward for Council consideration, further refinement, referral to outside agencies, and further public process in fall 2017. Council Update – In June 2017, Council:

- approved the Remembrance Day road closure (10:00 am to Noon, Saturday, November 11th) and park use for the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 257's parade to and ceremony at Huddlestone Park
- authorized sending a letter of support for the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 257's 2017 grant application to the New Horizons for Seniors Program, Employment & Social Development Canada
- authorized staff to sign a lease extending the Seaside Community Society's community use of 7232 and 7244 for a term ending December 31, 2019
- gave two readings to Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 60.35, to add a Commercial 8 zone and to rezone 7143 Caillet Road from Commercial 1 to Commercial 8 to facilitate future mixed (commercial/residential) development; held the public hearing; and referred the bylaw to staff to provide a report. Note: As the Hearing has closed, Council cannot receive further public input. Ouestions? Contact the Planner.
- authorized Councillors Coulson, Haime and Swain to attend the Union of BC Municipalities' Convention in Vancouver September 25 – 29, 2017 and all members of Council to attend meetings with Ministries

Property Taxes are Due On or Before July 4th!

The deadline to make property tax payments and submit Home Owner Grants without penalty is Tuesday, July 4, 2017.

Postmarks are not accepted as proof of payment.

NOTE: Home Owner Grants must be completed annually.

A 5% penalty is assessed on balances outstanding after
July 4th, and again after September 30th.

Thinking about home improvements?

With summer...comes home improvement projects such as sundecks, small retaining walls, fences and garden sheds! When planning these projects, the details need to be well thought out, including issues such as setbacks from property lines, underground utilities (Call before you Dig!), and right of way easements that need to be considered. Some projects may require a building permit.

The District of Lantzville contracts with the Regional District of Nanaimo to provide building inspection services, including receiving your building permit application. Contact 250.390.6530, building@rdn.bc.ca or visit 6330 Hammond Bay Road with building permit questions. It is always a good idea to contact the Community Planner at the District of Lantzville Office prior to submitting your application at the RDN, to confirm if you will require a Development Permit.

Bylaw Reminder

Burning Ban in Effect – Open fires are prohibited, including burn barrels, backyard burning, incinerators (all permits suspended), burn piles, burning grass, fireworks, binary exploding targets, sky lanterns, outdoor burning, etc. and are not permitted on private and public property in the District of Lantzville, Small campfires are still allowed but, due to the drying conditions, could be banned at any time. A Campfire is defined as any fire smaller than .5 meters high by .5 meters wide burning clean wood (no branches, yard waste, or pallets) used for cooking, heating and ceremonial purposes. It must have someone in attendance and you cannot burn yard debris or prohibited materials. Please fully extinguish any campfire after use, stay a safe distance away from combustibles and be considerate of your neighbors. Beach Fires follow the basic description of a campfire and will be prohibited once the campfire ban is imposed. The following additional considerations must be followed. Beach fires are only allowed between 06:00 am and 11:00 pm, they MUST be extinguished fully before 11:00 pm and MUST be placed below the high tide line away from combustibles like drift logs. NO PALLETS are to be burned, only clean fire wood. Questions? NOTE: Monitor the District's website for current status, to confirm if a total fire ban has gone into effect.

Stage 2 Watering Restrictions – Effective June 1st The District remains on Stage 2 watering restrictions but encourages conservation to prevent moving to more restrictive stages. Under Stage 2 watering restrictions, sprinkling is permitted between the hours of 7:00 am to 10:00 am OR 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm for a maximum of

2 hours every other day on the following days:

- Odd-numbered addresses on odd-numbered days
- Even-numbered addresses on even-numbered days Sprinkling includes watering lawns, ornamental shrubs, flowers and trees and use of pop-up spray, rotors and sprinklers. Putting in a new lawn? Apply for a new lawn permit. The following are permitted at any time in Stage 2: hand-watering, drip irrigation, and micro irrigation; washing vehicles, boats, and houses (siding) if using a hose with a shutoff device; filling fountains, pools, or hot tubs; pressure washing walkways, driveways and siding. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all watering restrictions, but watering in the early morning or in the evening is recommended due to less evaporation. Private wells are not subject to municipal watering restrictions, but conservation is encouraged because water is a shared resource.
