Lantzville Parks and Recreation

Commission was established in 2007 to advise Council on Parks and Recreation activities in the District. It consists of 6 community volunteers and 1 Member of Council. All positions are appointed by Council.

Over the past 5 years the Commission has focussed on the enhancement of **Minetown Day** and the development of:

- * A Parks, Trails and Recreation Plan
- * Trails and Journeyways Strategy
- * Tourism Development Plan

One of the District's most recent completed projects is the trail alongside the E&N rail line (pictured below) between Aulds and Ware Roads.



The Commission has worked on the enhancement of beach accesses such as Lavender Road (pictured below).



The Commission is currently working on a proposal to the Provincial Government and the Woodlot Licensee to enhance the Woodlot trail system (pictured below), including the historic Copley trail.



If the Province agrees to partner with the District on this proposal it is hoped that the trail system will include interpretive signage on the history of the area, the management of the Woodlot and the natural history.


