

APRIL 20, 2023 GREEN SHORES WORKSHOP IN LANTZVILLE

This workshop offers residents the Green Shores Level 1 course. The Course includes an overview of shoreline ecology and governance. The course also reviews methods for waterfront properties to mitigate the effect, on their properties, from rising sea levels, high tides and storm events. (Note: Effects are based on a projected 1 m rise in sea level).

This is an all-day workshop with an interactive classroom session in the morning held at the Lantzville Legion. The afternoon takes participants to Lantzville's foreshore for an opportunity to apply learnings through on-site analysis and discussion on how to implement key concepts on properties effected by sea level rise.
