Gulls of the Salish Sea Research

In February, Environment and Climate Change Canada (working with Fisheries and Oceans Canada, SFU, and University of Lethbridge) will be conducting research on gull species at parks/beaches within the District of Lantzville. The project will involve trap and release of several species of gulls to collect blood and feather samples as well as the deployment of GPS transmitters to track movements within the Salish Sea. This project will be a critical contribution to a larger complete assessment of the health of the Salish Sea.

Zoning Bylaw No. 180, 2020

On January 27, 2020, Council gave Zoning Bylaw No. 180, 2020 first and second reading, as amended. The Public Hearing will be held during the February 24, 2020 regular Council meeting, after which Council may consider additional readings. View Bylaw No. 180, as at second reading, at Municipal Hall or on the District website. Watch for the statutory notice for the Public Hearing to be published in mid-February in the Nanaimo News Bulletin, and posted at Municipal Hall and on the District's website.

Neighbourhood Small Grants for Lantzville

In 2020, the Nanaimo Foundation will be providing Neighbourhood Small Grants in the communities of Lantzville, Harewood, Ladysmith and Gabriola Island. Projects can be anything from block parties, to potlucks, art making, storytelling, neighbourhood walks or cleanups, invasive plant removal, scavenger hunts, clothing or book swaps and much more. Applications by individuals will be accepted by the Nanaimo Foundation March 15 to April 30, 2020 for grants from \$50 to \$500 to support projects that bring people together, share skills and knowledge, build a sense of belonging and responsibility, and respect and celebrate diversity.  Lantzville Road to the property owner to authorize storage of new vehicles for a one-year term
- approved the request for adjustment to utility account #003-09641000-000 for 7825 Lantzville Road (water leak)
- gave first, second and third readings to "District of Lantzville Subdivision and Development Works and Services Bylaw No. 175, 2020", as amended
- gave first and second readings to "District of Lantzville Zoning Bylaw No. 180, 2020", as amended

BYLAW REMINDERS

Avoid playing in the ditches! Although ditches can appear harmless, it's important to teach your children that ditches are not a safe place to play. The purpose of ditches is to move runoff from roadways and private property. At times of heavy rainfall, the water in ditches can move very quickly! Whether dry or filled with water, many ditches contain garbage or debris that could pose a hazard. And when filled with water, the banks of ditches are very slippery – if someone falls in, they can't easily get out! Encourage your children to find a safe place to play.

No Water Restrictions in effect until further notice.

Open Burning – From October 15, 2019 to April 15, 2020, residents are only permitted to burn IF every reasonable alternative has been pursued first. Burn only clean, dry organic materials, subject to conditions and requirements, e.g. less than 1.2 metres high by less than 1.8 metres in diameter, and subject to venting index. Call 1.888.281.2992 or visit the Ministry website (www.env.gov.bc.ca/epd/epdpa/venting) and search the daily Ventilation Index for CNTRL VAN ISLD at the bottom of the page to confirm if burning is GOOD, otherwise burning is prohibited. NO OPEN FIRES ARE PERMITTED ON ANY BEACH AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR - only portable propane campfire apparatus (CSA or ULC approved) are permitted on the beach between the hours of 11:00 am to 8:00 pm. NO LANDCLEARING FIRES ARE PERMITTED AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR - except for ALR lands.
