Any elector who wishes to vote before October 17, 2026, is eligible to vote at these Advance Voting opportunities. All Advance Voting ballots are counted after voting closes October 17, 2026.



Voting by Mail

Open to qualified electors of the District of Lantzville. If you wish to vote by mail, visit lantzville.ca or **Municipal Hall** to obtain an application to receive a mail ballot package. It is your responsibility to ensure that your completed ballot is delivered to the Chief Election Officer no later than 8:00 pm on General Voting Day, Saturday, October 17, 2026, to be counted.

ELECTOR REGISTRATION

If you are not on the List of Registered Electors, you may register at the time of voting by completing the required application form available at the voting place and make a declaration that you meet the requirements to be registered as set out below.

Resident Electors:

To register as a Resident Elector you must:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day, October 17, 2026;
- be a Canadian citizen (landed immigrants, permanent residents and corporations are not eligible);
- be a resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration (at time of voting);
- be a resident of the District of Lantzville the day of registration (at time of voting); and
- not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

To register, Resident Electors must produce two pieces of identification (at least one must have your signature) to prove who you are and where you live. Picture identification is not necessary. *Local Government Elections Regulation 380/93* defines acceptable identification, including:

| • Property Tax Notice | |

If you do not have ID showing where you live, you must provide at least two pieces of identification that prove who you are (at least one of them must have your signature on it) AND make a solemn declaration as to your place of residence. Please note that the combined Driver's Licence and Services Card is deemed to be one piece of identification.

Non-Resident Electors:

To register as a Non-resident Property Elector you must:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day, October 17, 2026;
- be a Canadian citizen (landed immigrants, permanent residents and corporations are not eligible);
- be a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration (at time of voting);
- be a registered owner of real property in the District of Lantzville for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration (at time of voting);
- not be entitled to register as a Resident Elector in the District of Lantzville; and
- not be disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

In addition, for Non-resident Property Electors:

- the only persons who are registered owners of the property, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust.
- if more than one person is registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the owners, register as a Non-resident Property Elector.

Non-resident Property Electors must produce **two pieces of identification as listed above** (at least one with a signature) to prove identity, and must also bring evidence that you are entitled to register in relation to the property, including:

- proof of ownership of the property (a recent Title Search); and
- written consent (form available from Municipal Hall) signed by a majority of all the owners, if there are multiple owners of the property, stating that you are the one owner who is designated as the Non-resident Property Elector for that property.

You may only register as a Non-resident Property Elector in relation to one piece of property regardless of how many properties you own in Lantzville. If you own property with a corporation, none of the owners of the property are eligible to vote.

Voters List

Until the close of General Voting Day on October 17, 2026, a copy of the List of Registered Electors will (upon declaring viewing for election purposes) be available for public inspection at the Municipal Hall during regular office hours, 8:30 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday, except statutory holidays.

Omitting Personal Information from the List – Electors may request that their address and other information be omitted from or obscured on the List of Registered Electors to protect their privacy or security. Contact the Municipal Hall for more details.
